L: Come to the water, all you who thirst—

L: Come to the water, all you who are weary—

P: come rest in the quiet pools of God's love.

L: Come to the water, all you who long for a justice—

P: come be renewed in God's ever-flowing stream.

All: For God is here among us, washing away the dust and grime of our lives, and pouring out the Spirit on all who thirst. Let's worship God together.

+Prayer of the Day and The Lord's Prayer-

Let us pray: **In the beginning, before creation, your Spirit was over the waters O God. Your creation depends on water for life; we are nourished, cleansed, and renewed by the water of life. In our worship today may we remember the waters of creation and the ways water is a part of our lives. We pray this in the name of Jesus Christ, who taught us to pray together: *Our father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours now and forever. Amen.***

Call to Reconciliation

Prayer of Confession

L: God of grace and purity, since the time of creation all life has depended on water, for cleanliness and nourishment.

P: You have entrusted water and life to our care.

L: But we take water for granted; we turn on the tap and there it is;

P: we think nothing of wasting it, polluting it, and making it unusable for ourselves and our neighbors.

L: Forgive us, O God, for neglecting our job as stewards of water. Remind us of your love for us with every encounter we have with water.

P: Empower us to work with those who don't have access to clean water, and to work for clean water for all of your good creation.

Assurance of Forgiveness *from the Font*

L: Through the waters of baptism, the same baptism that our risen Lord underwent, we are cleansed and made whole.

P: Thanks be to God! Amen.
