

CARE: An AWESOME blessing or an AWKWARD burden?

Care may sound simple and straightforward; however, churchgoers and leaders regularly struggle with what to do and say to people encountering difficult circumstances. Despite good intentions, we naturally respond in ways that are inept, inconsistent with Scripture, and come across as insensitive. Though often unseen, God's plan for loving and caring for one another is unmistakably revealed throughout the Bible. This workshop imparts the biblical basis and core principles of caring. Join us and discover how liberating it can be when caring aligns with Scripture and the mission of the church.

Presenter: Charles Puchta is founder and president of Care Ministry, a non-profit organization devoted to resourcing local churches and advancing a discipling model of care founded and grounded in Scripture.

Administrative Ministry: Stewarding the Significant Resources of People and Money

Administrative Ministry often translates into boring and efficient considerations that many don't consider "ministry". Yet any minister or elder with more than a month's experiences understands the role administration and managements plays in pastoral effectiveness and ministry effectiveness. Come and learn about the many sides of administration, including overseeing church finances, building and groups, working through leaders, motivating disciples, and overseeing staff. The Personnel Committee, Finance Committee, and Buildings and Grounds Committee may be particularly interested in this workshop, including any Elder who may be interested in information regarding pastoral staff transitions through resignation or retirement.

Percept for Mission and Evangelism

Percept is a fabulous resource for any congregation that wants to take a good look at how to love neighbors and serve their needs. What is Percept? Percept is an organization whose mission is to provide current demographic tools and resources to assist local congregations to understand the communities God has called them to serve. Attend this workshop to learn about online tools that enable your leaders to know who your neighbors are, what their needs are and how you might reach them.

How to Have a Difficult Conversation in the Body of Christ

In our disturbing and increasingly polarized culture, shouldn't the Church lead the way in "maintaining the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace"? Yet many Christians seem as divided as the rest of the country and find it best simply to avoid difficult subjects in church. Christians do not have to agree with one another, but we are directed to "bear with one another in love," with "humility, gentleness and patience." In our time together we will learn how to participate in difficult conversations in a productive way and become aware of the rich opportunities for unity and peace that are possible when we engage in these experiences.

Boundaries Training for Church Leaders

Dr Marie Fortune says, "I think boundaries are a gift...the thing that gives shape...to all of our relationships." This workshop focuses on ways that clergy and lay leaders can better understand boundaries and how roles and expectations influence them. It also explores the balance of power and vulnerability, better enabling clergy and laity to understand how this dynamic needs to be managed in order to protect and enrich congregations and the people they serve.

Presenter: *Reverend Jack Copley, Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), and Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist.*

Christian Stewardship and Giving in the 21st Century

How can a church encourage stewardship and giving in the context of the 21st century? Clarence Stoughton, former president of Wittenberg University, said that stewardship is everything we do after we say, "I believe." Much more than money is involved. A devotional resource for deepening this perspective will be presented. Personal decisions about the use of money is shaped by stewardship and Biblical guidance - which will be explored. However, things are different today. Concepts for improving giving opportunities and tools appropriate to our time will be discussed.

Presenters: *Harry Stone, Ruling Elder for Northminster Presbyterian Church, former chair of Planning, Budget and Stewardship; Chair of the Ohio River Basin Alliance • Laurie Laning, Ruling Elder, former Chair of Planning Budget, and Stewardship, and Missions Director for Northminster Presbyterian Church; retired senior Procter & Gamble executive; and Senior Advisor to Xavier's Leadership Center • Dana Glasgo, Ruling Elder, former Chair of Evangelism for Northminster Presbyterian Church, owner of Cincinnati Career Coach, and Member of the Board of Journey to Hope, Cincinnati Works, and Buckhorn Children and Family Services.*

Creating a Culture of Testimony in Your Congregation

Testimony is one of the practices that revitalizes congregation. While a challenge for those Presbyterians often understood to be "frozen chosen", during this workshop you will learn how to become a "thawed awed" Presbyterian. The workshop will explore testimony, describe how people and congregations grow through the practice of testimony in translating their faith experience into public words. Make room for testimony and your church's mission statement about changing lives will no longer only be something that you print in your bulletin every week; now it will be demonstrated every week in people's stories!

Networking in the Community

How do you make connections to benefit your cause in your community? In this workshop you will learn to identify strategies to enhance your connections to your neighborhood and community, gaining awareness regarding those most affected and most connected to the ministry needs in your neighborhood. You will also hear how to do a form of internal analysis that enables your congregation to identify actions steps to move your forward in networking and ministry in your community.

Presenter: Anita Brentley is a Ruling Elder from Carmel Presbyterian Church, Cincinnati, and a Community Engagement Officer with the Children's Hospital of Cincinnati.

The Nuts & Bolts of Being an Elder

This workshop will cover the nuts and bolts of Who? What? When? Where? Why? and How? to serve as an elder in God's church governed by Presbyterian polity. Whether you're a newish elder who never had training or a seasoned elder looking for renewal, this is the workshop for you. Make a full day of it and take Dr. Joan Gray's workshop about the spirituality of service.

Presenter: Reverend Lisa Stenner is the pastor of Union Presbyterian Church in Union, KY and the current Chair of Presbytery Council. While not born into the Presbyterian church, she is somewhat of a self-proclaimed polity nerd and appreciates the theological foundations of why we do what we do and how we do it.

Ruling Elders as Spiritual Leaders

The Book of Order reminds us that ruling elders are not thus called because they "lord it over" the congregation. Ruling elders are chosen "to discern and measure [the congregation's] fidelity to the Word of God, and to strengthen and nurture its faith and life" (G-2.0301). Discernment is the key to the ministry of ruling elder. Discernment is the act of listening for and to the Spirit, and seeking God's will. Come to this workshop to learn how to strengthen your practice as a Spiritual Leader of the Session and congregation.

Presenter: Reverend Joan Gray is the Moderator of the 217th General Assembly and author of many books on Presbyterian life. She will also be offering our keynote address at the Presbytery Meeting.

Pursuing Earth Care: Ideas and Strategies for Churches

God created a "very good" world, and gave humans the authority and responsibility to use and care for its resources. But this green planet, our only home, is in deep trouble. Many believe that sustaining it will require social and cultural transformations that go as deep as religion itself. Christians in particular need to take this call seriously, but where should a congregation begin? This workshop will explore Mount Auburn's experience becoming certified as a Presbyterian Earth Care Congregation and developing an innovative program of green faith, learning, living, and action. The workshop will provide an overview and program examples, including education, worship, outreach, and carbon neutrality for the building. We will reference tools and resources currently available and discuss new ways to develop a facilitator team in the Presbytery to provide speakers, field trips, Presbytery retreat, and on-line resources.

Presenters: John Tallmadge is a member of the Earth Care Leadership Team at Mount Auburn Presbyterian Church; author of three books and numerous essays on nature, culture, literature, and human values. • John Hancock, member of the Earth Care Leadership Team at Mount Auburn Presbyterian Church; emeritus professor of architecture at UC and expert on the design and economics of green energy options.
