### Scripture Reading Exodus 17:1-7

From the wilderness of Sin the whole  
congregation of the Israelites journeyed  
by stages, as the LORD commanded.  
They camped at Rephidim, but there  
was no water for the people to drink.

<sup>2</sup>The people quarreled with Moses, and  
said, "Give us water to drink." Moses  
said to them, "Why do you quarrel with  
me? Why do you test the LORD?" <sup>3</sup>But  
the people thirsted there for water; and  
the people complained against Moses  
and said, "Why did you bring us out of  
Egypt, to kill us and our children and

### Scripture Reading John 4:5-26

<sup>5</sup>So he came to a Samaritan city called  
Sychar, near the plot of ground that  
Jacob had given to his son Joseph.  
<sup>6</sup>Jacob's well was there, and Jesus,  
tired out by his journey, was sitting by  
the well. It was about noon. <sup>7</sup>A  
Samaritan woman came to draw water,  
and Jesus said to her, "Give me a  
drink." <sup>8</sup>(His disciples had gone to the  
city to buy food.) <sup>9</sup>The Samaritan  
woman said to him, "How is it that you,  
a Jew, ask a drink of me, a woman of  
Samaria?" (Jews do not share things in
