Giving Opportunity - Hurricane Emergency Relief in Nicaragua through CEPAD:

As we pointed out in our spring request for contributions for CEPAD in Nicaragua, CEPAD has been working for the past 5 years with 40 villages located all over Nicaragua. The 40 villages where CEPAD has been working are all in the rural parts of the country wherepoverty is high and many families struggle to earn or grow enough to feed themselves. All oftheir struggles have been magnified by the devastating 1-2 punch of Hurricanes Eta and Iota. CEPAD needs more funding than ever before for emergency relief. They must try to meet the overwhelming challenges caused by torrential rains that face communities over half the country, not just the Atlantic coastal areas. CEPAD is looking to buy seeds for quick-growing crops because this is their growing season.Farmer's and villager's crops were washed away. They need to be able to replant right away. In addition, CEPAD wants to purchase the corrugated tin roofing material to help those whose roofs were destroyed. We plan to supplement your contributions with part of our general mission offerings. Because of the urgency of the need in Nicaragua, we are asking that your forward your contributions (by mail or online) by December 15.
