Scripture Reading Psalm 103:1-14

- 1 Bless the Lord, O my soul, and all that is within me, bless his holy name.
- 2 Bless the LORD, O my soul, and do not forget all his benefits—
- 3 who forgives all your iniquity, who heals all your diseases,
- 4 who redeems your life from the Pit, who crowns you with steadfast love and mercy,
- 5 who satisfies you with good as long as you live so that your youth is renewed like the eagle's.
- 6 The LORD works vindication and justice for all who are oppressed.
- 7 He made known his ways to Moses, his acts to the people of Israel.
